On Chapter News, your Dayton Chapter is delighted to welcome four new counties to our Dayton region: Mercer, Auglaize, Shelby, and Logan. Welcome aboard! These counties, along with Allen County formed part of the Lima Chapter. The Lima Chapter Board decided to dissolve the Chapter for a key reason: lack of membership involvement. Every professional organization struggles with this same challenge: attracting members to

service. Organizations like ours compete with other activities for your time and for your resources.

So, what is our value proposition? Accomplishments like House Bill 189 (Tyler's Law) are the result of a concerted effort of the Ohio Society of Professional Engineers and local Chapters. Our active involvement at the Ohio General Assembly added a crucial perspective as well as language into this new Law. We are actively monitoring legislation that attempts against the engineering profession; our North Star is "to protect the public welfare, to safeguard life, health, or property". Just to
