Engineer's Week 2024 - By C.R. Weaver, P.E.

Every February, one week is set aside to acknowledge engineers for their contributions to the community and emphasize the importance of science, math, and technology in education. This week is commonly known as "Engineer's Week". Engineer's Week was founded by the National Society of Professional Engineers in 1951. In central Ohio, several outreach programs are promoted by FCC-OSPE. These include the Imagine Engineering program, Engineer-for-a-day program, and the Central Ohio Engineer's Week Luncheon.

The Engineer's Week Luncheon is a formal coalition of 11 Professional Engineering Organizations promoting engineering education and engineering cultural societies. The Luncheon is dedicated to raising public awareness of engineers' positive contributions to quality of life, the recognition of Engineers, and promotion of the importance of a technical education and a high level of math, science, technology, and associated promotion to teachers, and students.

For some trivia, Engineer's week begins on the Sunday of or preceding President George Washington's birthday (February 22nd). Why do we celebrate Engineer's Week to coincide with George Washington's birthday instead of the President's

Day, because George Washington was "the first Engineer"! Also, since Engineer's week began in 1951, which preceded the 1968 formalization of President's Day occurring on the third Monday of February, Engineer's week is not necessarily celebrated on President's Day. Therefore, Engineer's week typically coincides with President's Day, the third Monday of the month. Although when February 22, on a Sunday, Engineer's week and President's Day won't align. When is the next time this event will happen? February 2026. So, make sure you double check your schedule then!

This year Engineer's Week is February 18–24, 2024 and the Central Ohio Engineer's Week Luncheon is February 22, 2024. The 2024 theme, Welcome to the Future, is about celebrating today's achievements and paving the way for a brighter and more diverse future in engineering. 

Labor Dept. rule restores requirements to classify workers as independent contractors

Jan. 9 (UPI) -- The Labor Department issued a final rule on Tuesday that tightens the way businesses can classify employees as independent contractors, wiping out a Trump-era rule that loosened those rules for companies.

The department said the changes are meant to protect workers from wage theft, prevent some businesses to using the designation as an advantage over businesses that fully hire workers, and extend federal employee protections.

"Misclassifying employees as independent contractors is a serious issue that deprives workers of basic rights and protections," Acting Secretary of Labor Julie Su said in a statement.

"This rule will help protect workers, especially those facing the greatest risk of exploitation, by making sure they are classified properly and that they receive the wages they've earned."

The so-called "independent contractor" rule returns the six-factor review that was once in use to determine a worker's status.

According to the Labor Department, those factors include a worker's relationship with the employer, the financial stake and nature of any resources a

worker has invested in the work, the degree of permanence of the working relationship, the degree of control an employer has over the person's work, whether the work the person does is essential to the employee's business, and a factor regarding the worker's skill and initiative.

The Labor Department said the rule, initially proposed in 2022, rescinds the 2021 rule that it believes did not square with judicial precedent. That rule gave the workers a level of control over their work and the ability to profit from their position with personal investment as the primary factor in determining if they were independent contractors.

Uber said in a statement that the new rule did not change the way it operates and will not impact the current classification of its employees.

"Drivers across the country have made it overwhelmingly clear -- in their comments on this rule and in survey after survey -- that they do not want to lose the unique independence they enjoy," Uber said.

Uber's rival Lyft said they are still reviewing the new rule but it appears to be guidelines similar to that of the Obama administration and did not believe it presented a material change in operations as well.

DoorDash, one of the country's top online food delivery services, reacted the same way, saying it does not appear the new rule will affect the independence of their drivers.

"We will continue to engage with the Department of Labor, Congress and other stakeholders to find solutions that ensure Dashers maintain their flexibility while gaining access to new benefits and protections," DoorDash said.
