### SUPPORTING ENGINEERS FROM CLASSROOM TO CAREER

EFO champions engineering education from primary school through professional development programs

The Engineers Foundation of Ohio (EFO) celebrated its Diamond Anniversary in 2024, marking six decades of "advancing engineering education in Ohio"—EFO's mission, which supports engineers from early education through their careers.

Building on its rich history, EFO continues to uphold its mission, presenting innovative programs that inspire future engineers and empower professionals. The Foundation remains dedicated to providing access to timely topics, expert-led seminars, and valuable educational resources, while exploring new ways to elevate engineering education.

With a steadfast commitment to fostering the next generation of engineers, EFO's STEM programs— Imagine Engineering and Ohio MATHCOUNTS—and college scholarships sustained excellence in 2024.

Imagine Engineering, a program designed to introduce second graders to the wonders of engineering, reached an impressive 8,588 students in 2024 bringing participation to 158 percent of the previous year's level. Thanks to a generous grant from the P&G Fund of the Greater Cincinnati Foundation, EFO expanded the program's resource library in 2024, adding a Spanish translation of its original educational video, "Imagine Engineering." EFO's unique second grade program continues to captivate young learners with hands-on activities, sparking curiosity and laying the foundation for future engineering careers.

Ohio MATHCOUNTS remains a cornerstone of EFO's outreach efforts, providing middle school students with a dynamic and challenging platform to

sharpen their math skills. In 2024, 1,240 students from 133 schools participated in local competitions, demonstrating their problemsolving skills. In March, local winners advanced to the Ohio competition, and in May, the state's top four mathletes flew to the national finals in Washington, D.C., where they worked hard, enjoyed their shared passion for math with middle school students from around the U.S., and toured our nation's capital.

EFO's scholarship program continues to make a tangible difference in the lives of aspiring engineers. In 2024, the Foundation offered in excess of \$33,000 in scholarships to outstanding students pursuing engineering degrees. By supporting Ohio's brightest minds, EFO is investing in individual futures and strengthening the engineering profession. Rising tuition costs and inflation make it crucial for EFO to continue offering scholarships to help students achieve their dreams of becoming engineers.

Professionals report that they rely on EFO's quality continuing professional development (CPD) programs. With 49 CPD hours offered through diverse programs, participation has surged particularly with the convenience of virtual learning. In the last two years, "The Engineer As Leader," Fall CPD Conference, and December Seminar saw impressive registration numbers and offered engineers leadership, communication, and ethics training for career advancement, while keeping them abreast of evolving technical topics.

EFO's unwavering dedication to education, outreach, and professional development solidifies Ohio's role as a leader in engineering education excellence. As EFO looks to the future, its commitment to inspiring young minds, supporting students, and encouraging professional growth remains stronger than ever. With continued engineering community support, EFO will expand its impact for generations to come.





## EFO celebrated 60 years of excellence in engineering education and service in 2024

The Engineer's Foundation of Ohio (EFO) celebrated its **Diamond Anniversary** in 2024, mark-

ing six decades of commitment to advancing engineering education in Ohio. This milestone year was rewarding, as EFO's youth programs and CPD seminars continued to thrive in popularity.

Founded on June 16, 1964, EFO has become the premier organization supporting Ohio youth with STEM education programs and resources while providing engineering professionals with high-quality continuing education throughout their careers.

In 1968, EFO awarded its first scholarships, and by 2014, the scholarship program exceeded \$1.2 million in awards. During the 1970s, EFO produced the influen-

tial publication *Engineering Your Career* to help high school seniors prepare for engineering school.

EFO has been instrumental in supporting math and science education among school age students. In 1983, MATHCOUNTS was founded with EFO's support, and the first Ohio MATHCOUNTS

competition was hosted in 1984. And every year since then, this program has continued to inspire middle school students to excel in mathematics. In 1999, EFO launched the Imagine Engineering program for second graders. The program's success led to the creation of the educational video Imagine Engineering in 2021, followed by a Spanish translation in 2023.

EFO has consistently provided op-

portunities for professional growth. The Engineer as Leader professional training, established by EFO's Engineers Leadership Institute in 1968, celebrated its 56th anniversary in 2024.

The Foundation hosted its first Fall CPD Conference in 2006 and its first December Seminar in 2007. Since they were introduced, each program has annually provided PEs with valuable education in technical, managerial, and ethics topics for nearly two decades.

As EFO celebrated its Diamond Anniversary in 2024, it looked back on 60 years of remarkable achievements and forward to a future of continued growth and innovation. EFO's leaders – the organization's real gems – have been instrumental in its success.

### Fall CPD Conference engages Ohio PEs with insightful discussions

Attendees earned 15 CPD hours through expert-led technical, managerial & ethics seminars

The 2024 Virtual Fall CPD Conference, held on November 7-8, brought together professionals for two days of engaging and informative sessions. Attendees earned up to 15 CPD hours, including 2 hours of ethics training, through a diverse lineup of interesting and timely technical, managerial, and ethics seminars.

The conference featured expertled discussions on cutting-edge topics such as power ultrasound in medicine, the changing landscape of the natural gas industry, ethical decision-making strategies, and electrolysis-based hydrogen generation. One participant shared, "The electrolysis-based hydrogen generation topic was the best I have ever heard presented on this subject."

Attendees appreciated the seamless virtual experience and high-quality content. "Thank you for making this a valuable experience," noted one participant. Another thanked EFO for "such a well-run webinar."

The ethics seminars were a highlight, offering deep dives into ethical strategies and the implications of self-deception in engineering ethics. These sessions reinforced the importance of reviewing all of the ethical considerations when making engineering decisions.

In addition to technical sessions, managerial topics such as parliamentary procedures for efficient meetings and PFAS's effects on municipal water systems provided valuable insights.

The event's success was evident in the glowing feedback. "Thank you for another solid conference," said one participant, while others remarked, "Very informative and interesting," "I look forward to next year," and "Thanks for the wonderful meeting!"

With another successful conference concluded, EFO continues to provide access to high-quality CPD opportunities for professionals seeking to enhance their expertise. The Fall CPD Conference will return November 6-7, 2025.

### EFO equips engineers to engage in continuous improvement

EFO is dedicated to presenting professional training programs and seminars showcasing the latest business philosophies effective for engineering companies. In December 2024, EFO demonstrated this commitment by partnering with

leadership experts Raymond Waite, Jr., MS Computer Engineering, PMP®, and Patrick Donadio, MBA, CSP™, MCC, to present "Engineering Leadership: Kaizen & Systems Thinking for Continuous Improvement."

Kaizen, a Japanese philosophy focused on continuous improvement, complements systems thinking, an approach that helps engineers understand how different components within a system are interconnected. Together, these methods empower engineers to make informed decisions that promote long-term growth and efficiency.

The virtual seminar took a holistic approach to leadership development, equipping participants with tools for self-assessment, continuous improvement, and decision-making. Participants examined key traits of successful leaders and

discussed the difference between leading and managing. They explored techniques such as active listening, change process models, feedback loops, systems archetypes, and root cause analysis. One hour focused on ethics training, including data integrity and ethical reporting, promoting a safe and inclusive

environment, and managing stress and burnout.

The program received high praise for its practical approach and immediate impact on participants' leadership roles.

"PMP" is a certification mark of the Project Management Institute, which is registered in the United States and other nations.

### The Engineer as Leader training boosts professionals' skills and confidence

The 2024 Engineer As Leader program was a resounding success, bringing back David Bayless, PhD, PE, to elevate participants' leadership skills. Bayless, the former director of Ohio University's Robe Leadership Institute, guided attendees in improving team performance, handling tough conversations, and making ethical decisions. Through engaging, virtual lessons, participants learned to assess and develop their emotional intelligence, motivate teams, and navigate difficult

conversations. Feedback from attendees was over-whelmingly positive; participants called the program "relevant" and "thorough." PEs earned 10 CPD hours while gaining invaluable skills for leading effectively in engineering roles.
