**KEEP READING for MORE DETAILS on the AWARDS:**

***Legislator of the Year Award*** – This award recognizes a state legislator who has given significant support to the engineering profession, allowing the profession to maintain its commitment to the health, safety, and welfare of the public. The award candidate must be a member of the Ohio House of Representatives or of the Ohio Senate.

***Meritorious Service Award*** – This award is presented on the basis of service to OSPE at both, the Chapter and the state levels and for outstanding contributions to the goals and objectives of OSPE. The award recipient shall be an active member in his/her Chapter and the emphasis is placed on continuous meritorious service over a long period of time.

***NSPE Fellow Membership*** – The NSPE Fellow Program is a national program intended to recognize deserving professional engineers who have demonstrated long term professional service at the chapter, state and national levels of NSPE. The NSPE Board of Directors established the Fellow recognition program to honor those licensed members who have demonstrated exemplary service to the profession, the Society, and the community.

***OSPE Citation*** – This is the highest honor that OSPE bestows upon an engineer. This award is presented annually to an Ohio Engineer with distinguished leadership in the engineering profession and in appreciation of selfless devotion to the highest ideals of service to society and to fellow man; and for sustained contributions to the technical and professional aspects of the engineering professions.

***Outstanding Engineering Achievement Award*** – This award is presented in recognition for outstanding engineering accomplishments in manufacturing, construction or design, or combinations thereof. The nominated projects must have been completed during the calendar year preceding the award presentation and the nominated projects may be located outside the chapter geographical area.

***Outstanding Engineering Educator Award*** – This award is presented to a member of the engineering faculty of an ABET-accredited engineering program in an Ohio school and the educator shall have at least 5 years of experience subsequent to graduation from an accredited Engineering school and must be teaching an engineering course during the current term.

***Outstanding Engineering Student Award*** – This award is presented to an engineering student from an ABET accredited Ohio engineering school based on scholastic achievement, participation in professional, technical, and other activities.

***Professional Engineering Management Award*** – This award recognizes leadership, organizational, and management skills in an engineering environment. This award recipient has years of successful experience in Engineering management at various levels and has been instrumental in introducing a new process; or change to an existing process within the Engineering organization that he/she has successfully managed.

***Uncommon Engineer Award*** – This award recognizes the long and distinguished service to the engineering profession; devotion and commitment to the state society and the local chapter; high standards of professionalism; and guidance in the role of a team player. - **Continued, Page 6**

**Virtual field trips bring industry education into Ohio classrooms**

The Ohio Energy Project has been live-streaming virtual field trips since 2020 to continue showcasing engineering careers during the pandemic to the next generation.

FINDLAY, Ohio — Field trips were the best part of school, right?

Getting out of the classroom for a day, seeing cool stuff in person.

But how do field trips work today with so many pandemic protocols?

One Energy in Findlay hosted a Careers in Engineering field trip at its North Findlay campus Wednesday.

But the middle and high school audience was not here in person. Rather, they were watching virtually.

EU satellite programme will provide real-time greenhouse emissions monitoring

The Ohio Energy Project, which usually hosts these field trips in person adapted to the ongoing pandemic last year by hosting these visits via live stream.

Along with lowering the costs of the visits for the schools, it also expanded how many classrooms can participate.

"Typically on a field trip, we would be limited to schools that would be about 45 minutes away. But with this program, we are able to open it to the entire state. So we have 184 classes registered to participate in today's program," said Sue Tenney, education director at the Ohio Energy Project.

The Ohio Energy Project says it is vital to get the younger generation interested in potential engineering careers early.

For the people already in the field, it's a wonderful experience explaining what they do to these curious minds.

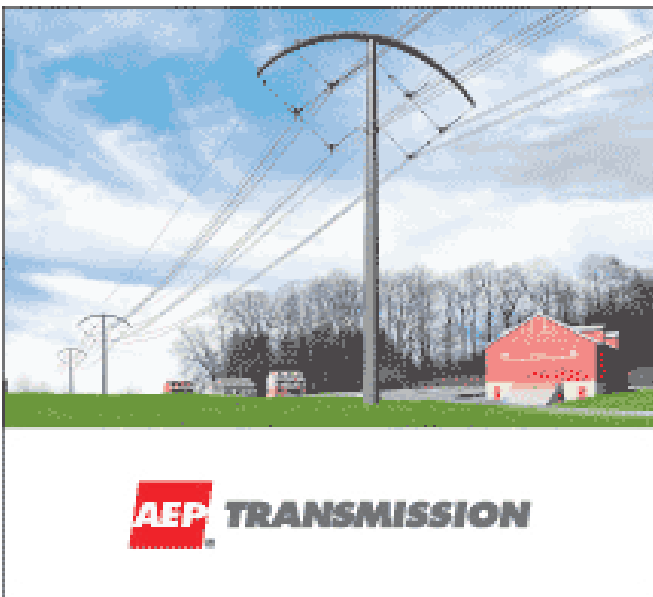
"Also keeps a fresh and excited perspective on things as well as what kind of silly question will they come up with that, 'Oh yeah! Here's how we can answer that to a kid!' And talk about it with them and really broaden our audience in who we're trying to reach," said Duncan Penizotto, the education engineer at One Energy.

Now, the Ohio Energy Project is now hosting multiple virtual field trips every year.

With these virtual field trips, they can host more students than ever before, and introduce a whole new generation to potential careers in engineering.

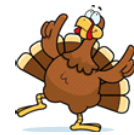
