**Presenters Biographical Information:** Shawn joined CH2M HILL in 1998. He is a design engineer, project manager, and serves as State Leader out of CH2M HILL's Columbus, OH office. He received a B.A. degree with a Physics major from Wittenberg University, a B.S. in Civil Engineering from Case

Western Reserve University, and an MBA from the University of Dayton. Over his professional career, Shawn has had the opportunity to work on challenging transportation projects including the I-70/I-75 System Interchange Reconstruction in Dayton, OH and the Marquette Interchange Reconstruction in Milwaukee, WI. He is currently serving as Design Manager of the \$200M I-71/670 Interchange Reconstruction here in Columbus. Shawn is a registered engineer in Ohio and Michigan.

Gary Gardner is the Technical Service Manager for ms consultants' Ohio bridge practice. He's a 1996 graduate of Case Western Reserve University and has spent the last 16 years working on long-span and complex bridge projects throughout the US and internationally. Some of his previous projects include the Leonard Zakim cable-stayed bridge in Boston, Massachusetts; the new Tacoma Narrows Bridge; the U.S. Grant Bridge in Portsmouth, Ohio; and the Ambassador Bridge Gateway Project in Detroit. Currently he serves as the lead bridge engineer on the I-70/I-71 East Interchange and 3 of the 5 planned Scioto River crossings for the 70/71 project. Mike Killilea has 16 years of experience in construction, and is a Project Manager at The Righter Company, Inc, where he has worked for the past 11 years. He received his Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering from the Ohio State University in June of 1997. He received his Master of Business Administration from Capital University in August 2001. Mike resides in Pataskala with his wife, Penny, and three daughters.

#### **OBITUARY**

Walter (Joe) Neidhardt P.E.

Joe Neidhardt died on July 5. Joe was widely known for his varied involvements in the central Ohio engineering and construction industries over a period of almost 60 years.

While his principal construction industry associations were with the V. N. Holderman, R.W. Wander and Kokosing construction companies, he was, as his obituary noted, a "road and bridge builder", both in his long career as a Civil Engineer as well as in his life of service to his family, his church, his community and his profession. Joe was a life member of NSPE, OSPE and the Franklin County chapter OSPE and long time member / contributor to, the Builders Exchange, Ohio Contractors Association, Columbus Area Chamber of Commerce. Development Committee for Greater Columbus, Riverside Methodist Church, Dublin Community Church, and other community, educational and social services organizations as well as a strong supporter of his Alma Mater (1951), Ohio Northern University.

Joe was preceded in death by his wife of 60 years, Donna. He is survived by his two sons, his three daughters and grandchildren.

## A History of FCC/OSPE – Prayers, Beer Bust, Missle Bases and Engineering Technicians

(This is the twelfth issue of the History of Franklin County Chapter, by L.E. Winget, Ph.D., P.E. The content is based on the Frank Geyer's compilation "A History of FCC", 1972.)

FY 1961-62 – Prayers and a Beer Bust – The United States Established the Military Assistance Command in South Korea. East Germans built the wall separating East and West Berlin (The Berlin Wall). The USSR exploded a 50 mega-ton nuclear device. John Glenn became the first US astronaut to orbit the earth. The Supreme Court ruled that the recitation of prayers in public schools was unconstitutional. The Israeli court sentenced Adolph Eichmann to death.

The Chapter elected N.L. Sylvester as President and R.E. DeMuth as Vice President. There were 12 Directors and 21 Chairs/Trustees. The dinner meetings were held at the Holiday Inn, Beechwold Restaurant, Nationwide Inn, Desert Inn and the August Wagner Brewery. In addition, two certificate ceremonies were held, November and May, at the Arts and Crafts Building. Both ceremonies included a light dinner and dance.

The topics at the other dinner meetings were:

- Getting Acquainted with Plastics (Ray Weber.)
- The Moho Project (Dr. J.L. McClelland.)
- The Wackie World of Television (Gene McPherson)

(Ray Weber, Manager of Cadillac Plastics Company; Dr. McClelland, Chief Engineer of the Moho Project; Gene McPherson, Executive Production Director, WBNS-TV.)

Other activities – A Candle Light Dinner Dance, with music by the Gay Tones led by Bll Denny. The 84<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting of OSPE was held at the Neil House March 15-17. The FCC Family Picnic was held at the Darby Creek Metropolitan Park on June 16.

Other items of interest – OSU offered special short courses for Engineers, Managers Scientists and Teachers, to assist them in keeping abreast of current trends. The Consulting Engineers functional group studied the problems of qualifications of municipal

planners serving on Industrial and Economic Planning Committees for the City of Columbus.

#### FY 1962-63 - Missile Bases and Engineering

- President DeGualle announced that Algeria was declared an independent state. Pope John XXIII opened the 21<sup>st</sup> ecumenical council designated as "Vatican II". Premier Khrushchev agreed to dismantle the Cuban missile basses and remove the nuclear weapons. France and West Germany signed a mutual cooperation pact. Sukarno was elected president for life by the Indonesian Congress. The Chinese-Soviet talks ended in failure.

R.E. DeMuth was elected President of FCC and R.H. McGuckin, Vice President. The Chapter changed the order of the Directors and Trustees. Hence, there were three Directors, four Trustees and 11 Chairs. The membership grew to 924, the largest in the state.

The first two meetings were held at the local industries, namely Western Electric Corporation, Bell Sound System Division of Thompson-Ramo-Wooldridge Corporation. An inspection tour was made at the Bell Sound System facility. The January meeting honored the life members of FCC. The February meeting honored the new members. Bernie Hatton, Chair of the Membership, was instrumental in bringing in 64 new members. A joint meeting with Engineering students and faculty was held at OSU in April. Certificates were presented at the May meeting. The speaker, F.J. Mulligan, OSPE general counsel, topic "The Cycle", addressed the new registered engineers.

Other events of Interest: The Executive Board voted to discontinue affiliation with the Columbus Technical Council. The Columbus Board of Education established a full time technical training school at Central High School building (now COSI). It offered 2 year courses in Mechanical, Electronic, Civil Engineering and Business Data. OSU contemplated the enlargement of the evening school to enable students to received 2 years credits in engineering courses. The public utilities

functional group held a meeting to discuss the advantages of communications with "Telstar", a satellite recently launched into orbit.

The FCC Annual Professional Engineers Picnic was at the WRFD picnic grounds in June 18, 1963.
